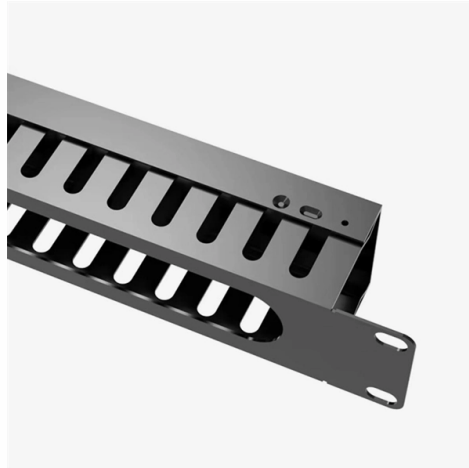


How many years does a pigtail jumper cable last
